Are You a "Mary" or a "Martha"?

The Gospel today tells the story of Martha and Mary and their hospitality toward Jesus. We see Martha getting overwhelmed with her tasks while Mary is sitting at the Lord's feet listening to him speak. Martha complains to the Lord that Mary isn't helping her in the preparation of the meal. Jesus' answer must have surprised Martha when he says she is anxious and worried about many things, but only one thing is needed, and Mary has wisely chosen the better part.

As I write this, I am preparing for my entire family to be home this coming weekend of July 10th and 11th. Jeff and I have three adult sons: Aaron lives in New York City, Matthew is in Portland, Oregon and the youngest, Nathan, is in Baraboo, Wisconsin. We haven't been together since Christmas, so I'm excited about this reunion. Since Christmas, Matthew has become engaged to Molly and a wedding date is set for June, 2011. To make this coming weekend even more memorable, Molly's parents are coming with Matthew and Molly to meet our family.

Since I already met Molly's parents, I know they are wonderful people, who have raised a beautiful daughter. In my quiet moments I know all of this is gift and I'm very grateful. I want to be concerned with people, rather than with things.

This week, may we take a look at our work, our homes, our families and question if we are choosing the better part as we serve the Lord and one another.

Don't Be Anxious

One can wonder how Luke's Gospel passage today might have been different if Mary, not Martha, had been the one to complain to Jesus, if Mary had said "Lord, look at her! Here you are sharing your wisdom and all she can think about is supper." Jesus may have noted, as Luke does, that Martha was burdened with much serving. Later in his writings, this same evangelist will describe in Acts how the early community set aside people whose ministry it is to see to the serving at table.

As a fully human person, Jesus knew the human needs that had to be tended. He doesn't deny this, nor does he chastise Martha for her working in service. He chides her for being anxious and worried. How can Martha - or any of us - be anxious or worried about the serving that needs to be done when we do it in the context of the Lord's will and wisdom? The Church has done more than any other institution to bear the heavy burdens of serving the ill, the uneducated, the suffering; has been "Martha" to countless of the little ones whom Christ told us were his very presence. God As Guest

I have often been a guest in Martha's home. I visit with someone whom I have longed to see, and am treated with great kindness and attention to my every need. The best china, the nicest desserts come out, and I never see the bottom of my coffee cup, for it is vigilantly refilled. Yet all the while, enjoying every good thing that comes to me, I am longing for my friend to sit down. After all, I have come to be with her, not her dishes.

I have also been to Mary's house. The moment I come in, she grabs me by the arm and we sit down. We talk, laugh, the hours go by and maybe I am hungry, or I have to cough before a glass of water is offered. The room gets cold and no one closes a window or stirs up the fire. I may be uncomfortable at Mary's house, but we have a darn good visit.

It is best, of course, not to have to choose. Martha's hospitality was welcome and good. Mary might have been more considerate of her sister, sharing the chores and the chance to be with Jesus. But if the choice has to be made, presence is always the better part. The relationship will keep without the cookies, but not without heart speaking to heart.

A Reflection:

The gospel today speaks to those in our society who have fallen into the trap of overwork or to those who consider the only value to be the maximum production of some product or service. The gospel seems to be addressed to those who have placed work before relationship - to those who have placed things before people.

The stress we encounter in our culture and the demands that we encounter in our lives have limited our ability to be hospitable - to take time for people - to put into practice the ideals that are modeled by the hospitality of Sarah and Abraham. The stress and busyness of our lives can prevent us from living in a contemplative way - a contemplative way toward God and a respectful, contemplative way toward our neighbor and our world.

Our contemporary world places lots of demands on our goodness. War and terrorism continue. One-fifth of the children in our country are living in poverty. One-sixth of our people are out of work. Banks and corporations seem to be doing much better than the "small people." The politics of our world has created millions of refugees. So many people are barely "making it." So many people need the basics of good food, adequate shelter, and decent clothing. So many people are not treated with dignity. Intolerance and discrimination continue. The environment is under stress. Scientists continue to remind us that our way of life is causing global warming and other long term damage to the planet. The pressure to find more oil and to make more money has resulted in a catastrophic oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

People are afraid.

As we address any of these needs, the scriptures today remind us that people in need - all people - should to be treated as people - as unique and precious human beings - as entitled to share in the bounty of the world.

The scriptures remind us that we are invited to be more contemplative. As we become more contemplative, we may learn to deal with people with greater dignity and we may even learn to deal with the planet in a more loving and healthy way.

Haiti - Latiboliere After the Earthquake

During the past few weeks the media has revisited Haiti (as we passed the 6 month anniversary of the devastating earthquake back in January. Seeing the images of orphans and tent cities brings on a sense of despair. We question whether our efforts make a difference. The resilience of the Haitian people seems to be dangerously close to resignation, acceptance of the horror and poverty they have lived in for so long, exasperated by the quake.

On a brighter note some signs of progress in our village! Last weekend we were able to welcome Monday Pamphile from Latiboliere for the weekend. He enjoyed the festival and was deeply moved by the welcome given him and the Spirit of friendship and generosity exhibited throughout the weekend. He reported a few very encouraging things in the outlying areas of Jeremie and Latiboliere where our sister parish is located on the southwest peninsula of the island.

First, the water line connecting the mountain springs above Latiboliere down the mountain to Latiboliere and beyond is complete. Heavy pipes have been buried and all the fountains are operating. This provides the people with fresh spring water throughout the area and will have significant influence on the health and well-being of the people. Second, CRS (Catholic Relief Services) has been providing emergency food for the area and just took over the lunch program for one of our chapels which adds 250 children (for a total of 1,000) getting lunch everyday. Third, the road connecting Jeremie to Port-au-Prince is progressing. It now only takes five hours to drive between the two cities (whereas it used to take eighteen). This will enable better commerce and lower transportation costs which will bring down the cost of both food and fuel.

These developments pave the way for other jobs and opportunities in our village. Stay tuned for more updates in the future.
