What are "I Can Statements?"

I Can Statements:

- help teachers assess student achievement throughout each lesson .
- allow for individual feedback.
- provide students with the opportunity to use self-assessment skills.
- help drive instruction.
- are set goals for student learning.

I Can Statements: 2nd

Reading and Language Arts

I Can...

- Produce, expand, and rearrange sentences.
- Use reference materials as needed to check and correct spelling.
- Demonstrate command of conventions.
- Compare formal and informal use of English.
- Identify context clues within sentences and know how to use them to construct meaning of unknown or multiple meaning of words.
- Determine or clarify meaning of unknown or multiple meaning words and phrases.
- Demonstrate understanding of word relationships.
- Apply grade level phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words.
- Apply reading strategies for accuracy, rate, and expression.
- Describe key details in an informational text using the questions who, what, where, when why, and how.
- Identify the main topic of a multi-paragraph informational text.
- Identify the structure of the story.
- Ask questions to better understand topics and text.
- Write an opinion piece which introduces the topic or book.
- Write informative/ explanatory texts that focus on a specific topic.

Religion

I Can...

- Express belief in God as Trinity and can discuss the role of each person in the Trinity.
- Know the importance of gathering regularly with God's family at Mass to worship and ask God's blessings.
- Act as Jesus would act by being loving, kind, forgiving, and helpful at home, school, church, and in the community.
- Prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Math

I Can...

- Identify the attributes of triangles, quadrilaterals, pentagons, hexagons, and cubes (e.g., faces, angles, sides, vertices, etc.)
- Identify the unit of length for the tool used (inches, centimeters, feet, meters)
- Write time using analog clocks and digital clocks.
- Solve problems relating to data in graphs by using addition and subtraction.
- Explain the value of each digit in a three-digit number. .
- Compare two three-digit numbers based on place value of each digit.
- Use strategies to add up to four two-digit numbers.

Science

I Can...

- Classify matter as solid, liquids, and gas.
- Tell the difference between a control and variable in an investigation. .
- Research how the earth changes suddenly and over time.
- Plan and carry out investigations.
- Compare and contrast the different types of living things that are found in different places on land and water.
- Construct a model of landforms and bodies of water.

Social Studies

I Can...

- Illustrate the process of production and consumption of a product.
- Construct a family tree and relate it to immigration.
- Know the difference between city, state, country, and world.
- Distinguish between neighborhood, city/ community, state, country, and continent.
- Identify symbols of the country— flag, eagle, and Statue of Liberty.
- Identify the commonalities and differences of families.
- Express and sow compassion to those in need.
